School-Led Review 2024

During Term 2 we will be undertaking our school-led review around teaching and learning at Tingalpa State School. This will involve surveys and discussions with staff, students, parents/

carers and the community. This is the first stage of the review: Scan and Assess.



In this stage we gather rich information, through the lens of the School Improvement Tool (SIT), about what is working well, the factors impacting on

educational achievement, wellbeing and engagement and culture and inclusion, identify specific problems of practice that, when addressed, would make a significant difference to student outcomes.

We will be emailing details of a parent/carer survey during the next few weeks and will offer parent/carer forums later this term.

Student State School Consent

It is the school's usual practice to take photographs or record images of students and occasionally to publish limited personal information and student materials for the purpose of celebrating student achievement and promoting the school and more broadly celebrating Queensland education. Consent to use your child's name, photograph, voice/video recording or year level is requested at time of enrolment via the "State School Consent Form". If you wish to make changes to consent for your child, please request a new State School Consent Form from the school office.

Change to Pick-up Arrangements

At times parents need to call the office about change of pick-up arrangements. Office staff work hard to ensure these messages get to students. We have had afternoons where many families have called around 2:55pm to change arrangements. This late in the afternoon makes it difficult to get messages to classes before students are released from their class. Please call with any change of arrangements as soon as you can so we can ensure the message is passed on and there is no confusion for students or families. Thank you.

Road Safety

We all want our students to arrive safely to school and home at the end of the day. It is particularly important for students cycling or scootering to school to follow safety requirements and road rules. In Australia, transport injuries are the most common cause of child injury death and second most common cause of injury related hospital admission for children aged 0 to 14 years.

I initially taught at Tingalpa before moving to Bundaberg where I worked in the Support Education department of a school before moving back to Tingalpa State School. I have a passion for inclusion in schools and ensuring every student has the opportunity to find success at school.

I am excited to be working with the leadership team, school staff and community in this role and look forward to meeting you around the school.

ANZAC Day

ANZAC Day has been remembered in Queensland state schools since 1916, the year following the landing at Gallipoli. We are proud to continue the remembrance of the first ANZAC Day at Tingalpa State School.

Date: Wednesday, 24 April 2024

Time: 9:00am

Venue: School Hall

Our school community are welcome to join our ceremony.

Anzac Day, 25 April, is one of Australia's most important national occasions. It marks the anniversary of the first major military action fought by Australian and New Zealand forces during the First World War. It goes beyond the



anniversary of the landing on Gallipoli in 1915. It is the day on which we remember all Australians and New Zealanders who served and died in war and on operational service. The spirit of Anzac, with its qualities of courage, mateship and sacrifice, continues to have meaning and relevance for our sense of national identity.

Why is this day special to Australians?

When war broke out in 1914 Australia had been a federated nation for only 13 years, and its government was eager to establish a reputation among the nations of the world. When Britain declared war in August 1914 Australia was automatically placed on the side of the Commonwealth. In 1915 Australian and New Zealand soldiers formed part of the expedition that set out to capture the Gallipoli peninsula in order to open the Dardanelles to the allied navies. The ultimate objective was to capture Constantinople (now Istanbul), the capital of the Ottoman Empire, an ally of Germany.

The Australian and New Zealand forces landed on Gallipoli on 25 April, meeting fierce resistance from the Ottoman Turkish defenders. What had been planned as a bold stroke to knock Turkey out of the war quickly became a stalemate, and the campaign dragged on for eight months. At the end of 1915 the allied forces were evacuated from the peninsula, with both sides having suffered heavy casualties and endured great hardships. More than 8,000 Australian soldiers died in the campaign. Gallipoli had a profound impact on Australians at home, and 25 April soon became the day on which Australians remembered the sacrifice of those who died in the war. Although the Gallipoli campaign failed in its military objectives, the actions of Australian and New Zealand forces during the campaign left a powerful legacy. What became known as the "ANZAC legend" became an important part of the identity of both nations, shaping the ways in which they viewed both their past and their future.

Rosemary: an ancient symbol of remembrance, it has particular significance for Australians as it grows wild on the slopes of Gallipoli. The ancients believed it strengthened the memory, and on



this account, it became an emblem of mateship and a symbol of remembrance. It is worn on or around ANZAC Day to honour the memory of the fallen and those who have served.

School Photos

Cycling to school

Benefits of cycling:

- keeps your children healthy (it helps to prevent chronic disease)
- improves your children's mood and wellbeing
- increases your children's energy levels
- supports children's sense of independent mobility
- improves your children's concentration and sleep
- strengthens your children's muscles
- reduces air pollution, noise pollution, traffic and our reliance on fossil fuels
- · gets your children to school quickly
- is free

Safety tips for cycling

If your child is in primary school, ride with them until they are confident. Once they have the skills and feel safe, try to find a friend from their school they can ride with.

Teach your child:

- the safest route to school (such as on a bike path or through suburban streets)
- to ride on the left side of the road, at least 1 metre from the curb (if they are in high school and feel comfortable), or on the footpath (if they are in primary school or not confident at cycling)
- to try and stay 1 metre behind vehicles or bikes in front of them
- to wear their helmet correctly (so that it cannot move back or forward when they move their head)
- the bike road rules
- to wear bright coloured clothing when riding
- to avoid being followed closely by vehicles
- that they shouldn't ever 'double' their friends
- to ride with a maximum of 2 cyclists side-by-side

- what to do in an emergency it's a good idea to have them carry a mobile with emergency numbers on speed dial
- to use hand signals to let others know where they are going and what they are doing
- how to lock their bike up securely.

Bike paths

Bike paths, separated paths and shared paths provide a safe way for you and your children to ride to school. These paths are tracks for cyclists and pedestrians only—they keep you and your children away from all motor vehicle traffic. They are particularly a good idea if you or your children are learning to ride. There are many bike paths in Queensland—particularly in South East Queensland and Cairns.

Readers Cup Challenge

We are excited to have entered a team into the Reader's Cup Challenge, a state-wide competition for young readers, organised by the Queensland branch of the Children's Book Council of Australia. Teams of four to five students together read a set of books, and then compete with other teams to answer quiz questions from the books. Winners from regional competitions then compete in a state final.
